A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

The Fourth Sunday of Lent brings us the story of the man blind from birth (John 9:1-41). Our Lord Jesus Christ heals the man, but this serves only to heighten the tension between Christ and the Pharisees. Jesus said, “I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind.”

Our Lord has stern words to those who consider themselves “righteous.” They are not capable of opening themselves to healing mercy of God and, hence, are spiritually blind. The season of Lent and true discipleship demand that we be radically honest and acknowledge our need for God’s forgiveness. We all experience the brokenness that is a consequence of Original Sin. It is Jesus who comes to our rescue and lifts us up again in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

On Wednesday, February 28th, the Diocese of Cleveland asked all parishes to host an Evening of Reconciliation from 5:00 – 8:00 p.m. Both Fr. Greg Schaut and I heard confessions for 3 hours straight here at St. Mary’s in Chardon. It was a wonderful experience for both of us and I am very thankful for his help. Had I been by myself, the confessions would have gone long past 8:00 p.m.

There is a hunger for healing and wholeness in the hearts of many people today. It is the one, true God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, who correctly fulfills our longing for ultimate truth, goodness and beauty. The man born blind would have his life changed in his encounter with Jesus Christ. We too are called to encounter Christ, especially through prayer and the sacraments of Eucharist and Penance. I pray that the remaining weeks of Lent will offer you abundant opportunities to encounter the Living God. Please keep those to be confirmed from our parish in your prayers as we celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation this Monday, March 12th at 7:00 p.m.

HANDS UNITED IN HOPE & LOVE

TOGETHER FOR THE GLORY OF GOD

Please prayerfully consider joining us on our 4th parish partnership trip to The Sacred Heart of Jesus, in Chacraseca, Nicaragua, on December 3rd-10th 2018. Our primary activity will be walking in faith, hope and love with our sister parish during the La Purisima, a 9 day, uniquely Nicaraguan festival celebrating the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin Mary. It is the biggest celebration of the year -a mixture of Halloween, Christmas and even a little bit of the 4th of July. Together we will roll up our sleeves for the Lord to help build a more permanent structure for the satellite chapel of the Divino Nino. We will be joining hearts during a Bible Study class for the Youth of the parish. We will also learn about their culture; experiencing daily life with them; hear stories of their struggles, hopes, and dreams.

We will celebrate mass with our friends in Christand of course; there will be some time for sightseeing!

WHERE WILL WE STAY?

We will stay in Chacraseca at the Casa de Paz (Peace House)— a small dormitory-style house built by Sister Joan Uhlen, a Maryknoll sister. Living arrangements will be very modest, and we will eat “tipico” Nicaraguan food (mostly rice and beans) prepared by the community. We will have running water (a rarity in rural Nicaragua) with indoor bathrooms and showers! We’ll be gathering material and supplies to donate to the community. We will use our checked bag to transport these items, so travelers will be limited to one checked bag and one carryon suitcase per person for their personal items for the trip — it’s a chance to see what we can do without!

WHAT WILL IT COST?

The cost is \$825 per person PLUS airfare. (about \$800 per person round trip) Personal costs will be meals en route to and from Nicaragua, souvenirs, visa (\$10), and any unscheduled activities the team decides to add. This covers lodging, meals, in-country transportation, interpreter expenses, trip coordination, and Nicaraguan leadership. Your nonrefundable deposit of \$200 payable to JustHope will hold your spot and be applied to your final balance. Participants will need a current Passport to enter Nicaragua and the CDC recommends the following vaccines for Nicaragua; typhoid, hepatitis A , Hepatitis B and influenza. We needed to secure at least 8 participants to utilize JustHope’s infrastructure and move forward with this December 2018 trip. **The mission trip dates are planned around the La Purisima, December 3rd–10th. However, if there is an overwhelming response, we plan to offer two back to back trips; November 23rd - 30th and December 3rd- 10th. Keeping the teams smaller makes for a more intimate, meaningful mission trip experience. Hope you can join us!**

Participants should be in good health, able to walk at least ¼ mile. For more information **contact Dale George at maridalegeo@msn.com 440-343-0329** For more information about JustHope, visit their website, www.justhope.org!
